
NEWB Reports

BOM Report

The Board, while often seen as unobtrusive and in the background, has been working consistently during the year to ensure the smooth running of the school and to provide support and high quality facilities for the pupils and staff in the school.

There were two changes to the Board this year, with Fr. Liam Rigney joining as a Patron's Nominee and Mr. Cathal Fenton joining as a Staff Nominee.

Earlier in the year, the Board met with the Inspectors as part of the Whole School Evaluation and again prior to the publication of the report. It welcomed the fact that the report recognised the high

quality of education provision within the school and that it acknowledged the significant contribution of the staff, the Board and the PTA in achieving this. (Link to report on school website).

As well as ensuring ongoing building maintenance, it has dealt with the detection and repair of a major water leak; improvement of school security by the provision of a new external door acces system; improved wet day facilities by extending the shelter (with PTA support); arranging for All Weather Pitch Maintenance; overseen the purchase and installation of new teaching computers in all classrooms.

Development and review of policies is an important responsibility of the Board of Management. Policies reviewed this year include Administration of Medicine, Extra Personal Vacation, Lone Parents, Staff Absence Procedures, Parent/Teacher Meetings, Relationships and Sexuality Education, Religion, Special Education Needs, Sexual Harassment, Child Protection, Adult Bullying, Complaints Procedure and Assessment. As directed by the DES, a new Anti-Bullying Policy is under development.

Through the course of the year, the Board deals with a variety of matters such as staff Professional Development, use of Croke Park Agreement additional hours, leasing of the school premises (an audit of this is currently underway), Staff Appointments, Enrolment matters etc. It deals with issues as they arise, such as Child Protection, Discipline, Attendance, communication from parents, etc. It also communicates and liases with various state and local organisations.

Note: While the 8 members of the Board come from different sectors of the school community (Patron, Staff, Parents, Community), once nominated, they become part of the body corporate – i.e. they are not representatives of any particular group, but act in the overall best interest of the school community. Anyone wishing to bring a matter to the attention of the Board should write to the Chairperson, care of the school (- it will be immediately forwarded to him).
