

School Attendance

The National Education Welfare Board has recently come under the newly formed umbrella body TÚSLA. You will be familiar with the NEWB as having overall responsibility for School Attendance.

We have been required to monitor school attendance and, disappointingly, have discovered a worrying trend. For every month this year, attendance figures have been worse than the same month last year.

Missing School = Missing Out

At recent assemblies, we've emphasised to the boys that missing school = missing out; a day missed = a day lost. While absolutely recognising that a child who is ill should not be in school, we ask that parents try to ensure that there are no avoidable absences for your children.

Attendance Awards

To encourage the boys and to promote a positive attitude towards school attendance we are introducing attendance awards – commencing at the end of this week, as follows:

Weekly Class Awards

Trophy for best class attendance.

Special Prize (e.g. no homework, extra play) for 100% attendance.



Termly Awards

Class: Pizza Party for best class attendance.

Individual: Full attendance awards.

Yearly Awards

Class: Class outing for best class attendance.

Individual: Full attendance awards.

We trust that we can depend on your co-operation and support in promoting a positive attitude towards attendance an ethic that will stand to them life-long.

Meanwhile, we emphasise again, and will continue to repeat at class level, that no pupil should attend school while sick.
