### Digital Schools of Distinction Award

Most of you will be familiar with the Green Flag Award, which promotes the concept of environmental awareness in school communities. Maynooth Boys’ NS has an excellent record in this programme, having achieved 5 Green Flags awards.

There is a similar type of award structure for schools achieving excellence in its use of ICTs in teaching and learning. *“The Digital Schools of Distinction Award recognises excellence in integrating ICT into learning and teaching. This award – open only to primary schools at present – aims to build on progress, and to encourage improvement.”*

It is a wonderful recognition of the work that is done by school staff on a daily basis, integrating ICTs seamlessly into the teaching and learning and into school administration. Special thanks also to our PTA and Board of Management, without whose support in the provision of ICT equipment and resources, this achievement would not have been possible. We look forward to the formal presentation of the award, which will take place this week.

### Irish Flag delivered by Army

On Tuesday 29<sup>th</sup> September, we hosted a very special ceremony at the school. In advance of the Centenary Celebration of the Easter 1916 Rising, members of the Irish Army presented to important items to the school – a copy of the 1916 Proclamation and an Irish Flag.



Initially, Lft. E. Harney addressed the entire student body and parents/grandparents who had assembled on the playground for the occasion. She gave some background about the flag.

Then came the presentation of the flag. Chosen to receive the flag on behalf of the school were 6 pupils who had relatives directly involved in the 1916 rising. These included:-

*Nicholas* (1<sup>st</sup> Class) & *Cillian Swift* (3<sup>rd</sup> Class) whose great granduncle was actively involved in the Rising in Tipperary.

*Sean & Gerry McDonagh* (both 4<sup>th</sup> class) whose great grand uncles were organiser and Captain in North Tipperary, were interred after the Rising and both subsequently elected to the Dail as TDs.

*Leo Murphy* (Sen. Infants) whose great great grandfather fought in Boland's Mill under Éamonn De Valera and his great great granduncle fought and was shot dead in the Battle of Mount St. Bridge.

*Darragh O'Donnell* (Jun. Infants) whose great grandmother was a first cousin of one of the Seven Signatures of the 1916 Proclamation, Seán MacDiarmada.

The second part of the ceremony was the presentation and reading of a copy of the 1916 Proclamation. Corporal Tony O'Neill read the Proclamation with the help of Cian O'Neill (6<sup>th</sup> class), who made a wonderful delivery of the 4<sup>th</sup> paragraph. Pádraig Mac Piarais

During the coming year, we hope to record further detail of these brave men and other relatives of our pupils who were involved, or have information about that time.
