# Parent Teacher Meetings

At the annual parent teacher meeting, an appointment is scheduled for every pupil in each class. On a given afternoon, there are appointments for approximately 15 other parents so it is essential that everybody sticks to the allotted 10 minute meeting. If you wish to have a longer discussion with your son's teacher, you will need to arrange a further appointment - the meeting on the day cannot be extended, as it would unreasonably delay everybody else.



Therefore, if you find yourself waiting for your meeting beyond your allotted time, please knock on the classroom door.

Meetings with class teachers will normally take place in your son's classroom. Likewise, Resource Teachers will be located in their rooms for meetings with parents. Names and locations will be clearly displayed inside the front door.

#### After School Hours

Our insurers have reminded us that children should not be allowed to re-enter the school building after they have left at the end of the school day – for example, to collect a book/copy/coat that they left behind in their classroom. Please keep this in mind if your son suggests going back for something.

## Wet Mornings

Further to the teaching staff volunteering to undertake additional supervision before the commencement of the school day, procedures for wet mornings have improved significantly for the pupils.

Entrance to the building at 9.10am remains via the door at the shelter ONLY, (the front/main entrance will be locked). However, instead of having to assemble in the PE Hall, the boys are now permitted to go directly to their classrooms.

Good behaviour on the way to and in the classrooms before 9.20am when their teacher is an absolute requirement. Please be aware that if this is not adhered to, the privilege of entering the school before 9.20am may be withdrawn from individual pupils.

# Sensational Writing 4<sup>th</sup> & 5<sup>th</sup> Classes

On Friday the 6<sup>th</sup> of November, the two 4<sup>th</sup> Classes and the two 5<sup>th</sup> Classes, took part in a creative writing workshop with the children's author, Debbie Thomas. As an introduction to the workshop, she told the boys that she had recently interviewed the world famous

children's author, Michael Morpurgo, about his life as an author and about the latest book he is writing. It is based on the life of a decorated British soldier, Henry Tandey, who fought in World War 1. She told us a fascinating story about Henry Tandey.

During the writing workshop, Debbie showed the boys how easy it can be to come up with a simple story or poem using the first words, thoughts or ideas that come into your head, no matter how random they might be. By working in pairs and in groups, the boys used her helpful tips to write interesting and exciting short stories and poems in the space of a few minutes. They were all surprised by how imaginative they could be in such a short time and they really enjoyed taking part in the workshop, which will help with their creative writing skills.
