

### Artist for a Day – Paul Woods – World War 1 Landscapes

On Friday the 27<sup>th</sup> of November, Paul Woods (an artist) came in to show us how to paint WW1landscapes. He also had an assistant called Alex. Paul Woods paints WW1 art using inspiration from aerial photographs and perspective.

Paul started off by showing us examples of WW1 paintings. Some of the famous WW1 paintings were painted by Paul Knash and his brother John Knash. They were paintings of scenes that they had experienced during the war.

Next we started to paint! We all had a sponge each and we mixed the colours orange, red and yellow to paint the sky of WW1. Paul also painted with us! We had to wait for that to dry before we could paint the mucky, damp ground. Once it had dried we began the next stage using brushes.

This allowed us to add more detail. We painted burnt down trees, razor-wired fences, airplanes, mind blowing bombs and massive zeppelins.

After all that, he showed us some of his own paintings from his website <u>www.paulwoodsart.com</u>. Most of his paintings are magnificent inspired by WW1 art. He is currently studying WW1 history in Maynooth University.
