This is our school's Literacy Week. Each class is taking part in activities to encourage reading for pleasure.


On Wednesday 16th January, Maynooth Library staff visited our infant classes with their Mascot, Oíche Owl, for storytelling.

- Always leave time for questions and to talk about the book and the illustrations
