Restrictions on smart phones from September 2019



In conjunction with Internet Safety Week, we wish to draw your attention to a number of changes in our Mobile Phones Policy. Parents must now fill out a permission slip which is only available from the office. This form must be returned to your son's class teacher. The phone must be concealed and switched off during the course of the day. More details are available on our website.

Following discussion, at staff level relating to recent research and media focus and in consultation with the PTA we have decided that from September 2019 children will not be



allowed to have an internet enabled 'smart' phone on school premises. Non-internet enabled phones will be permitted under the same strict conditions currently in operation. Non-internet enabled phones are produced by big brands, such as Alcatel and Nokia, and are readily available in many outlets.

As always, the safety and well-being of our pupils is a priority and we aim to promote the safe, responsible and positive use of technology at all times.
