Has your son Book Rental Scheme books?

In a few weeks' time, your son's school books in the Book Rental Scheme will be collected to be organised for next year's classes. If any books are missing, or in poor condition, you will be required to replace/pay for them. Please carry out some "maintenance work" to ensure the books are in good condition. We do not collect workbooks, but text books in classes from 3rd – 6th and readers in Junior Infants to 2nd Class are collected. Please take a few minutes to check the cover and spine of your son's books and, if needs be, remove any pencil marks from inside the book also.

Board of Management Accounts

The Board of Management accounts for the 2019/2020 school year were certified and approved by the Board of Management during the recent school closure this year. The Financial Report to Parents, which is a summary statement for the school year, is available on request from the office.

School Reports

School reports will be made available to parents on Aladdin Connect before the end of the school year. We will notify parents of their availability in due course.

Standardised tests 2021

Drumcondra and Sigma-T standardised tests have been completed and the results will be included in the report cards. It is important to put the results in the context of a very different year where pupils have missed out on a large amount of in-person teaching and learning. Inevitably, this will have some effect on the outcomes of standardised testing. Additionally, the school has moved to an updated and newly standardised version of Drumcondra Literacy tests for all classes in 2021/2022. The restandardisation will have an affect the outcome some Drumcondra tests. A change in test scores for individual pupils could be as a result of a real change in their achievement, however, as this year sees us transition from older tests to new ones, change is more likely to occur because pupil achievement is now measured against an up-to-date reference group.
