Parents are advised of serious difficulties faced by the school filling long-term vacancies and finding substitute teachers to cover short-term absences. It is likely that there will be disruption to the provision of special education teaching and support for pupils with English as an Additional Language. Classes will be split more regularly as a result of the shortage of substitute teachers.

The situation is far from ideal but the difficulties being experienced are not isolated to St Mary's BNS and are prevalent across much of the Dublin and North Kildare region.

Pupil Absences

If your son is absent from school, you can enter the reason for his absence using Aladdin Connect once the roll has been taken by his class teacher at 10:30 a.m. If you enter the reason for absence, there is no need to send an email/note to the teacher.

Last year, we saw a notable increase in our attendance rate, rising from 88% in 2021/22 to a commendable 91.7% in 2022/23. While this progress is indeed positive, we aim to further enhance our attendance to meet our target of 93%. Your continued support is invaluable in achieving this goal.

Please be aware that parents/guardians will receive text notifications from school if their child has been absent for 10, 15 or 20 days.
