Plastic Free 4 Schools Project – A Message from the Student Council

The Student Council would like to ask for the whole school community's support in helping our pupils to protect the environment. For February, our aim is to reduce single use plastics in our lunchboxes.

The School Council will be conducting regular survey of lunchboxes and our race to zero challenge begins on the 12th of February! To help your son's class succeed please ensure your son's lunchbox follows these **five Plastic Free Charter guidelines** below:

- 1. Use a lunch box that you can put food into loose.
- 2. Say no to clingfilm, tinfoil and plastic sandwich bags.
- 3. Avoid juices and smoothies with plastic straws.
- 4. Avoid disposable cutlery. If you have any clean it and reuse it.
- 5. Clean and recycle all rigid plastics at home.



The Student Council are also encouraging all pupils to **drink water** throughout the day. When purchasing a refillable bottle, try to avoid plastic and opt for a **metal container** instead.

Finally, don't throw away your **plastic bottle lids!** We have a drop box location in the school lobby for plastic drinks lids to prevent these from going to landfill. Small plastics are most harmful to our oceans. We hope to repurpose them, so we need lots of different colours and sizes!
